P4G District Official Community Plan approved by Saskatoon Region Councils

The Saskatoon North Partnership for Growth (P4G) is pleased to announce the P4G District Official Community Plan (DOCP) was unanimously approved by the 5 municipal councils of the partnership following a virtual public hearing this afternoon.

Each of the councils of Corman Park, Martensville, Osler, Saskatoon and Warman gave 2nd and 3rd readings to bylaws adopting the P4G DOCP.

The DOCP is a foundational piece in the establishment of the new P4G Planning District that is proposed to replace the existing Corman Park-Saskatoon Planning District. The DOCP includes a vision, principles and policies to guide long term planning in the region.

By working in partnership on land use, development, and infrastructure, the P4G municipalities are striving to ensure a proactive and coordinated approach to planning for future growth.

“This is truly a historic occasion for the Saskatoon region. The DOCP cements the commitment of the partners to work together for the betterment of the region for the next 50-60 years. The path to the future has been set,” said Neal Sarnecki, Director of the Saskatoon North Partnership for Growth.

The DOCP is the cornerstone of the proposed new P4G Planning District. Following approval of a new District Zoning Bylaw early next year by Corman Park, the bylaws will be forwarded to the Province for approval and formal establishment of the Planning District.
